








Garbage Separation Pamphlet

Revised Feb. 2025

Let's protect our resources by correct garbage separation! (This pamphlet has been updated in February 2025)

Please put out your garbage by 8:00 a.m. on collection day and avoid doing so the night before to help keep our streets clean and prevent crime!
Please dispose of newspapers, cardboard, magazines, miscellaneous paper, and cartons in clear or semi-clear bags measuring 45 liters or less so that the contents are visible!

Burnable garbage Twice a week Every <input type="checkbox"/> & <input type="checkbox"/>			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Remove excess moisture from kitchen garbage. Use old paper, such as newspaper, to soak up cooking oil or use a solidifier. Remove soiling from disposable nappies. Place wood chips or pruning waste in bags or tie them together, ensuring they are no longer than 50cm and no thicker than 10cm. If the bundle weighs more than three bags full, take it to the city's disposal facility. Place plastic containers, packaging, and cartons that cannot be thoroughly cleaned in burnable garbage.
Twice monthly on the <input type="checkbox"/> and <input type="checkbox"/> (the day of the week)	Monday Plastic packaging Cartons Used clothing		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Items must have a ♻️ symbol. Heavily soiled items must be placed in "burnable garbage" even if they bear the ♻️ symbol. Dispose of used clothing in transparent or semi-transparent bags to protect them from rain. Cartons in water, then dismantle them and tie the pieces together in a cross. Dispose of heavily soiled items and cartons with foil in the "burnable garbage."
	Tuesday Non-burnable garbage Plastic bottles		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Plastic bottles include those used for soy sauce, seasonings and beverages. Rinse plastic bottles in water and remove the caps and labels. Dispose of heavily soiled items in the "burnable garbage." Wrap broken glassware, tableware, and knives in paper or cloth and label them as "キケン" (Dangerous).
	Wednesday Newspapers Cardboard		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> When disposing of newspapers in bags, tie them in a cross. Dispose of newspaper inserts alongside newspapers. Do not mix catalogs and newspapers. Fold up cardboard and tie it with string. Remove all tape and staples from cardboard boxes.
	Thursday Cans Glass bottles	 <p>*From February 2025, cans and bottles must be placed in separate bags.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> From February 2025, cans and bottles must be disposed of in separate bags. Cans must bear the ♻️ symbols and measure 13cm by 13cm by 18cm. If they do not meet these requirements, dispose of them in "non-burnable garbage." Remove the caps and rinse out the bottles. Heavily soiled and broken bottles, as well as glassware, must be disposed of as "non-burnable garbage."
	Friday Non-burnable garbage Plastic bottles Spray cans		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Refer to the Tuesday section for information about non-burnable garbage and plastic bottles. Dispose of spray cans in separate bags from "non-burnable garbage" without puncturing them.
	Saturday Magazines Miscellaneous paper Used small home appliances Hazardous waste		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Miscellaneous paper can be disposed of by tying them with string, placing them in cardboard boxes, or inserting them into magazines. Tie books, catalogs, booklets, dictionaries, and magazines with strings in a cross. When disposing of hazardous waste, label the bag as "有害" (Hazardous). Small rechargeable batteries, including mobile phone batteries and lithium-ion cells, must be insulated and disposed of as hazardous waste. Remove the batteries from small battery-operated electrical appliances. Wherever possible, remove small rechargeable batteries, such as lithium-ion cell batteries, from small household appliances, insulate them, and dispose of them as hazardous waste. If they cannot be removed, dispose of them while still contained in small home appliances.

Bulky garbage

Bulky garbage is defined as any single item that is too large to fit into a 45-liter bag or is so heavy that the bag tears.

*Please note that even **within the same town, collection days may differ in certain areas**, such as along thoroughfares, so please check with your neighbors. Please ensure that your garbage is placed in transparent or semi-transparent bags no larger than 45 liters, so that the contents are visible. If the bags' contents are not visible **because they are black or blue in color, your garbage may not be collected**.

Types of garbage the city cannot dispose of.	Materials subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Act.	TVs, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, washing machines, tumble dryers	Ask the original vendor or the store where you plan to purchase a replacement to dispose of the item. If you want to dispose of the item yourself, buy a recycling ticket and take the item to a designated drop-off point.
	Hazardous materials	Propane gas tanks, gasoline, kerosene, light fuel oil, etc. Poisons, agricultural chemicals, fire extinguishers, paint thinners	Please get in touch with the original vendor.
	Infectious medical waste	Infectious medical waste disposed of by medical care facilities, such as needles.	Please get in touch with a waste disposal company that specializes in handling specially controlled industrial waste.
	Industrial waste	Materials disposed of through business activities subject to laws include waste generated during the construction, renovation, and demolition of residential buildings and other projects.	Please get in touch with a waste disposal company that specializes in industrial waste.
	Materials that cannot be processed at the city's facility	Concrete (including the base for clothes airers), tiles, bricks, garden stones, soil (including garden soil), fireproof safes, motorcycles over 50cc capacity, vinyl chloride pipes, bowling balls, bicycles and parts (tires, batteries, sideboards, etc.), boilers, pianos, surfboards, metallic barrels, farm equipment, etc.	Please get in touch with the original vendor or waste disposal company.

Bringing in Garbage

From May 7, 2025, you must make a reservation to bring in business and household garbage.

Refer to the Separation Guide for Household Garbage about how to make a reservation.

- ① Make a reservation by scanning the QR code on the right or calling ☎0743-85-4890
- ② On the date and time of your reservation, visit the Tenri City Cleaning Management Office to have your identity confirmed.
- ③ After your identity is confirmed, you will receive a QR code to enter the disposal facility. Proceed to the facility with the QR code.



Note There are separate drop-off locations for burnable, bulky, non-burnable, and recyclable garbage. If you have a mix of items, load your vehicle so that you can unload recyclables first, then bulky and non-burnables, and finally burnables.

Handling fees

Household garbage	Free of charge for items up to 100kg. Items over 100kg will be charged at a rate of ¥80 for every 10kg (rounding up to the nearest 10kg).
Office waste	¥160 for every 10kg (rounding up to the nearest 10kg)
Small animals	¥1,030 per animal. Please bring the animal in a cardboard box measuring no larger than 435 by 335 by 320mm. The animal will be disposed of as waste, so you will be unable to collect the bones.
